

Julie Chambers' early experience in music began as a young elementary student studying piano, singing in choirs, and performing in band. She continued her study of piano and voice throughout school and was led to study music education at Capital University, where she studied voice, piano, and organ. She also took an opportunity to study abroad at the Kodaly Institute in Kecskemet, Hungary.

After Capital, Mrs. Chambers began teaching vocal music in the New Lexington City School District and piano and/or voice lessons through her own studio. During her time there she completed her masters degree from Capital University with Kodaly Certification, and took a year leave of absence to study music in Hungary for the second time where she received a Music Pedagogy Diploma from the Kodaly Institute. After 5 years of public and private music education and church music, Mrs. Chambers left the public school to focus on private teaching and church music.

Mrs. Chambers is the current organist, adult choir accompanist, and children's choir director at Grove City United Methodist Church where she often performs vocal solos in addition to her directing and keyboarding duties. In addition to her BME, MME, Kodaly Certification and Pedagogy diploma, Mrs. Chambers has attended numerous workshops and classes demonstrating the Orff and Dalcroze philosophies to teaching music and recently finished Estill Level 1.
